

TECHNOLOGY HASN'T KILLED PUBLIC LIBRARIES. It's inspired them to transform & stay relevant.

In the early 2000s, as archives shifted online, futurists predicted an imminent death to public libraries. But the threat of obsolescence made libraries take proactive steps to remain relevant in a digital world. They thought creatively about how to translate services they have always offered – **universal access to information** – into new formats.

Libraries digitized their collections and networked their catalogues, **exponentially extending the range of materials users could access.** They introduced e-books and e-readers to read them with. They mounted screens to watch movies or to play video games.

They also installed computers crucial to that 14% of the population who don't have access to the internet at home. And they

wired up their spaces with free WiFi, retrofitting extra outlets so users could plug in their own devices.


Besides offering new technologies and services, libraries offer people a welcoming, safe space to gather without the pressure to spend money. Investing in attractive, versatile furnishings, they have actively encouraged people to dwell in their spaces, whether this is to read a newspaper, complete a job application online, or to study.

In an age where communication technologies create both efficiency as well as forms of isolation, such spaces assume a renewed social importance.



“Libraries saved my life and helped me be a good parent too!”

This heartfelt sentence led to a conversation with DeAnna Pearl, Community Prevention Specialist in Tillamook and lifelong library patron.

DeAnna grew up in a home filled with hardship and uncertainty. One common side effect of a traumatic childhood is an inability to concentrate, and DeAnna couldn't read. Through a wonderful teacher and safe space in her library, she learned to read and found the escape and protection she needed to not only survive but thrive in the world.

Guided into reading a variety of books about people, areas and ideas *“allowed me to see outside my own life.”* From a child unable to read and told by her high school guidance counselor *“I'm not going to waste time on you because you aren't going anywhere,”* **to attending graduate school at prestigious George Washington University, in Washington DC**, her constant was her local library. Libraries provided a protective and welcoming environment in her journey from coast to coast. Across our nation, public libraries are a safeguard in the communities they serve. Where else do all ages and walks of life, work, learn and play together?

Guided into reading a variety of books about people, areas and ideas *“allowed me to see outside my own life.”*

DeAnna has 12 library cards, one from each area she lived. Her collection includes a card from the Library of Congress where she spent hours researching as part of her job in Washington DC. The research skills she learned at libraries served her well in school and life.

After 15 years as a trainer and mentor, DeAnna feels her trusted relationships with adults, including librarians, was the single greatest protective factor in her young life. A trusted adult who really *‘saw’* her, called her by name, and cared. She went on to duplicate that experience with the children in her family.

Raising foster children, including her own daughter, DeAnna turned to libraries as the perfect *‘hang out’* space to be part of her community. She welcomed the chance for her daughter to be exposed to multi-generational and multi-cultural groups. DeAnna said: *“As a single parent, being able to go to a library for free was a blessing.”* and *“Libraries are the microcosms of communities. They bond individuals into communities and create gathering space where everybody belongs.”*

Thank you to DeAnna for sharing her inspiring journey and reminding us what a crucial role libraries play in our communities.



Tillamook County Library Foundation Park Update



and children gathered on Saturday, August 25th, to celebrate the official groundbreaking for the Library Park. The ceremony began with short speeches by Library Director Sara Charlton, Library Foundation President Ruth LaFrance and Library Board Vice-Chair Chris Chiola. State Senator Betsy Johnson wasn't able to attend but sent her best wishes and a strong acknowledgment of the unique place that the Tillamook County Library System plays in the lives of Tillamook County citizens. Commissioner Bill Baertlein read her letter.

Following a group photo of Library and Foundation Board members, Ruth stepped on the green beribboned shovel and, after several attempts to break through three inches of tough grass and dig into the cement hard soil, managed to pop up a divot of sod. The crowd issued a call of, **"LET THE PARK BEGIN!"**



Then it was lemonade and cookies and music provided by the duo of Sara Charlton and Carl Wilson. Several library supporters took this opportunity to purchase a piece of the Park through the continuing Park Plot sale fundraiser available only at the Main Branch.

The Library Park is now officially underway. The Park Work Group, made up of Library and Foundation Board members and zealous Tillamook County citizens, will be working out construction details and doing a lot of grant writing.

Last year the community raised 255 lbs. of food from 8 partnering sites!







Three Facts About Our Popular Ukulele Program

1. Easy to Learn!

Ukuleles are one of the easiest musical instruments to learn. Even people who have no musical training can learn very quickly. With a few brief instructions, our classes are playing complete songs during the first five minutes of class!

2. You Are Never Too Old!

As long as your fingers still move, you can learn to play the ukulele.

We've had 90-year-old music fans in our classes and they loved it! Learning a new skill is good for the brain, too. While these classes are aimed at an adult crowd, we've had teens attend with good results, too. We don't currently have a minimum age limit. Just keep in mind that the instruction will be provided at an adult level.

3. Come Early for a Beginner Lesson!

While our ukulele jams begin at 1:00 pm, instructors are there for beginner instruction starting at 12:30 pm. We'll go over the basics and get you up to speed in a hurry. If you don't have a ukulele, you can borrow one of ours.

Incidentally, the county did not pay a penny for these ukuleles. They were gifted to us by a generous library patron in Manzanita!


