From these two original BT'S in Oct. 1949 in the presence of Ray Watkins I set a ½" iron pipe 3 ft long 2 ft in the ground and marked a new BT a live fir 26" in dia. Dears \$50W, 17.0 ft. \$25BT scribed on bark.
