Returning to the corner to sections 4-5-9-10, we ran Easterly by traverse to the quarter corner between sections 3 and 10. At a point 2660.8 ft. S. 89° 26' E. from the section corner, we found a heap of shattered stone with 1/4 cut in the face of one piece. We also found a dead 30" fir S.  $24^{\circ}$  45' W. 15.2 ft. scribed 1/4 S.  $\tilde{B}$ .T., and a rotten stump N.  $77^{\circ}$  E. 15 ft. For the quarter corner we set a 2"X 48" galv. iron pipe with a stange brass cap on which is stamped a line with short cross mark and the numbers 3 and 10 and, circumferentially, 1/4 SEC. COR. T. 3 N. R. 6 W.W.M. - O.S.H.D. We piled the fragments of stone around the pipe and set a 4"X 4" white guard post stenciled 1/4 SEC. COR. on 2 faces in black. No live trees available for bearing trees.

This corner lies 2649.3 ft. N. 890 00! W. from the corner to sections . 3-2-10 and 11.

Thence we ran N. 0° 15' W. thru the center of section 3.
