

REWITNESSED CORNER FOR STATE OF OREGON - DEPARTMENT OF FORESTRY  
4907 Third St., Tillamook, Oregon 97141

One quarter corner common to Sections 4 and 5, T1N, R7W, W.M.,  
Tillamook County, Oregon.

ORIGINAL by Henry Meldrum, September 23, 1884.

No evidence of original corner found.

REESTABLISHED by Louis W. Amort RE2311, August 5, 1953. (Book 2,  
page 286, also Plat #B-337 Tillamook Co. Records.)

1 1/2"x40" Galvanized iron pipe with 3" bronze cap, 30" in ground, in  
mound of stone; now 36" in ground, in place.

50" Fir snag bears N27 1/2E 55.9 ft.; now a 5 ft. high stump with  
scribes 1/4 S4 BT RE2311 visible.

5" Maple bears S44W 13.1 ft.; in place with no scribes visible.  
This tree has apparently been broken off and resprouted.

4"x4"x48" white painted Cedar post 1.4 ft. East of pipe; in place.

From above pipe with marks "LS1998 1990" added a:

11" Fir bears N14E 9.1 ft. to face; scribed 1/4S4BT.

12" Fir bears N49W 25.4 ft. to face; scribed 1/4S5BT.

Metal location poster on new BTs and 5" Maple BT.

Also 1953 poster on 50" Fir snag BT.

3/4" brass washer marked "LS1998" nailed to face of new BTs.
