

Director's Report



Library Operations

The library extended a job offer on a library assistant 2 position that will be based out of Tillamook Main and Pacific City. We hope to have background and reference checks completed in time for them to start on November 1st. A library assistant 2 at Tillamook Main has resigned, and we are recruiting to fill that position.

The painting of the Tillamook Main building is mostly complete. The next phase of the project is to replace a section of the roof and all of the gutters with a start date still to be determined.




This fall work will begin on the last part of the park project funded by a Tillamook County TLT grant. It will involve placing the remaining pavers in front of the stage area and creating a labyrinth walk design in that area.

Tillamook County began the process of reviewing job descriptions throughout the organization for updates and to make sure they are comprehensive and clear. The County is working with Trüpp HR on this project.

Main Manager Luke, IT Specialist Will, and I met with an Envisionware representative to plan for the installation of new self-check machines. They will replace the current two devices at Tillamook Main that are out of compliance for updates and no longer covered for maintenance.

The library completed an inventory of library materials that began on October 8th. The inventory helps the library identify missing materials and materials that don't appear to be available in the catalog but are on the shelf. This effort will help make the migration to Koha integrated library system in the spring smoother.



Library staff at Tillamook Main are working on a project to update wayfinding signage in the library. They are developing vinyl signage that identifies different areas of the library and increases our bilingual signage.

The library took part in the Great Shakeout event on October 17th at 10:17 a.m. Staff practiced evacuating the building and gathering at the nearest meeting point for emergencies.

On October 17th, I was appointed as the American Library Association's Core Division President-Elect. This will be the start of a three-year term as President-Elect, President, and Past President. I am excited to contribute in this new role to the overall profession. I'm thankful for the support from Commissioner Bell, the library's management team, and library staff as I take on this new role.

Library Programs and Outreach

The library has revived movie nights on Wednesdays. Movies start at 6 p.m. on Wednesdays after the Tillamook Main building closes. Movies are shown in the meeting rooms and popcorn is provided. The South County branch is also hosting movies on the third Friday of each month at 3:30.




The library gallery space now has a new exhibit: Clink! A Taste of Oregon Wine. The new exhibit from the Oregon Historical Society explores the history of wine in Oregon. Below is a photo of the space in transition with the new blank walls for the gallery.



The Library is now providing a 24/7 New York Times subscription with an all-accesspass that includes newspaper articles, NYT Cooking, Games, the Athletic and Wirecutter for patrons. To access the New York Times online, when at a library location, you can connect directly through a library computer or wifi. To learn how to access remotely, simply visit the library website at tillabook.org navigate to the E-resources menu and click the New York Times link. Patrons can read today's newspaper online in a browser or with the app and can use the TimesMachine to download old articles dating back to 1851.

A team of library staff met to begin planning for the 2025 Summer Reading Program. The team will be working on different areas of the program including game development, public programming and crafts, prizes, marketing, and internal communication. The program development will be focused on reaching community members with the greatest barriers to participation. The team will gather again in early December with draft plans for each area to discuss and finalize the overall program plan.

The library held a Freedom to Read event on Saturday, October 19 in collaboration with Consejo Hispano to feature Hispanic and Latinx authors by inviting attendees to read their favorite passages from books they love.



I attended the Rockaway Beach Friends Meeting in October. The group had questions about news related to book bans. I addressed the library's process for materials reconsideration and some of the challenges that libraries are facing currently. The Friends expressed their support for the library's efforts to maintan free and open access to library materials.

I met with the North Tillamook Library Friends President, Craig Nerm, this month. We discussed the progress on ADA door replacement, the completion of the Manzanita Library roof replacement, and up-coming board transitions.

The South County Library Club implemented new ADA-compliant doors at the Pacific City Library. The implementation has been successful and the library is now even more accessible to the community.


